Class Descriptions

My Little Buddy (Parent & Tot)

Ages 2 1/2 to 4. This is a great family program where skaters and parents learn together the basics of skating. Skaters advance from Parent & Tot to the Snowplow Sam.

Snowplow Sam

Ages 3 to 6. This tot beginner program is designed to make the skaters more comfortable and in control when they are on the ice. The Snowplow program is built on 3 levels. Snowplow Sam 1 introduces skills such as: marching across the ice (both forward and backward), gliding, and the proper falling and standing techniques. Snowplow Sam 2 introduces skills such as: swizzles, slaloms in and out of obstacles, and stronger forward and backward skating. Snowplow Sam 3 introduces skills such as: backward swizzles, forward-to-back turns, snowplow stops, one-foot gliding, along with other intermediate skating skills.

Basic 1

This class has been designed for the beginner skater **ages 6 and over.** Students learn proper falling and standing skills, forward and backward skating, two-foot glides, hopping, and beginning stops. Children learn to be comfortable on skates and really enjoy the ice. Recommended for figure skating and hockey.

Basic 2-5

Recommended for both hockey and figure skaters, these classes teach the fundamentals of all skating. A few of the many elements taught include forward & backward skating, stops, cross-overs, turns, balance and edges.

Basic 6 – Freestyle

For those interested in figure skating. Learn advanced skating skills, including basic jumps and spins.

Adult

Designed for the beginning adult who has never skated, or has yet to achieve a smooth stroke and gliding motion. Skills to be introduced are falling and recovery, forward strides and glides, backward skating, two-foot glides, and forward chasses. Skaters then progress to Adult levels 2-4.

What Do I Need For Class?

All skaters should have proper skates, helmet with face mask, shin guards, elbow pads, hockey gloves and a hockey stick.

Class Description

This is a beginning program that will cover the fundamentals of hockey. The class is divided into 2 parts. The first part is hockey skating skills. This includes how to gain speed on the ice, starts, stops and hockey turns, along with other important skating skills. The second part is the stick skills. Proper stickhandling, passing and shooting skills will be covered. This is a great program for the new hockey player and the Mighty-mite player. Skaters should have completed Snowplow Sam III or basic one and have good forward and backwards skills.
